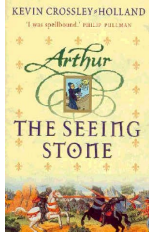

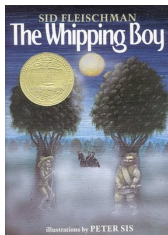


Crossley-Holland, Kevin.

Follow the exciting adventures of Prince Brat, who returns to the palace a changed boy after being held ransom. Winner of the prestigious Newbery award.

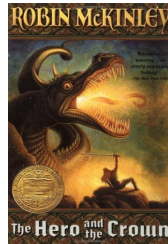


Levine, Gail Carson.

This Newbery Honor author has written a compelling tale about a princess who must venture beyond the protective confines of her castle and outwit a dragon to save her sister from the Gray Death.

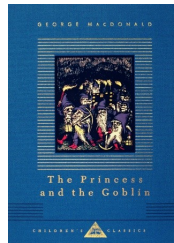


McKinley, Robin.

In this Newbery award-winning novel, the feisty daughter of a Damarian king fights dragons and an evil mage in order to win the Hero's Crown.

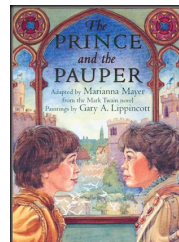


MacDonald, George.

Twain, Mark.

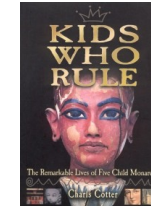
The Prince and the Pauper. 1882; 2003

Don't Know Much About the Kings and Queens of England. 2002.

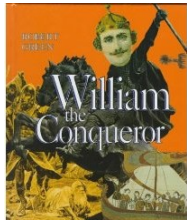

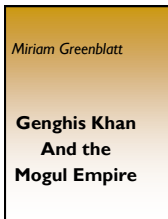


Green, Robert.

When William the Conqueror invaded England in 1066 and became king, he changed the face of a country.

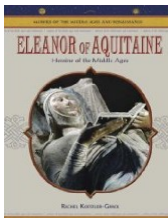


Greenblatt, Miriam.

This lively description of Khan's life as a ruler describes both his leadership qualities and his ruthless acts.

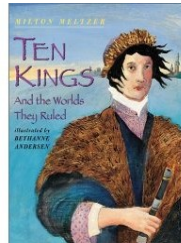


Koestler-Grack, Rachel A.

This mother of famous kings was also the queen consort of a French and English king.

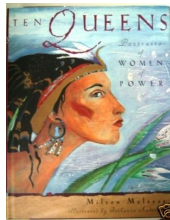


Meltzer, Milton.

Winner of the Laura Ingalls Wilder award, Milton Meltzer provides a wealth of information about a diverse group of powerful rulers.

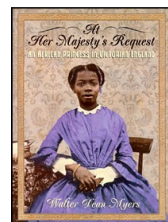

This biography by a Newbery Honor award author examines the life of an African princess saved from execution, and brought to England.

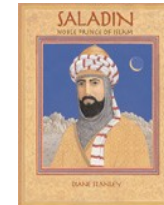


Somerset Fry, Plantagenet.

A wide-ranging biographical encyclopedia of monarchs from England and Scotland.

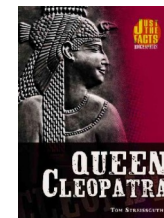


Stanley, Diane.
